BlueRev new paradigm will be piloted in 3 different pilot regions throughout Europe, i.e. Denmark-Greenland, Italy and Estonia, to tailor value chains, from valorization of co-products as feedstock to processing/ conversion to final products, in order to revitalize local communities, both in a territorial and social sense and contribute to positive environmental and social impacts.

The project will analyze these value chains according to the three above mentioned dimensions, as well as environmental barriers and potentialities, local capacities such as feedstocks, infrastructure, human skills, innovation actors, including community knowledge and marginalized groups, by using existing or improved monitoring systems and indicators to evaluate the effectiveness of the value chains. The analysis will serve BlueRev to allow the transition of local communities




